



Case Statement

The Catholic Diocese of Lansing is moving forward on a historic journey to raise \$65 million in its first-ever comprehensive diocesan wide campaign titled *Witness to Hope*. Based on the vision of Bishop Boyea's pastoral letter *Go Announce the Gospel of Jesus Christ*, this campaign will advance the ability of our parishes, as well as our diocese, to fulfill the shared mission given to us by Jesus for years to come.

Strengthening Our Parishes: \$22.8 Million (Hebrew 10:24-25)

Parishes are where we meet the Lord in sacrament and community. It is at our parishes that we can best live our faith, call others to Christ and help to build up the Kingdom of God. For this reason, 35% of all of the funds raised up to the parish goal, 65% up to 1.2X the parish goal, and 100% of everything else raised by the parish will fund the parish's own mission and capital priorities. These funds will help parishes build new facilities for ministry, maintain current facilities, pay off debt, build parish endowments, or support other local needs. Parishes with significant projects can opt for a larger goal to meet those needs. The results of *Witness to Hope* will be stronger parishes, better able to advance the sacred mission of the Church.

Forming Our Youth and Families: \$15.2 Million (Joshua 24:15)

The future of our faith revolves around the evangelization of our children and young families. To support this effort these funds will be used in the following manner:

Catholic School Financial Aid Endowment: \$12.5 Million

Making a Catholic education available to those families that cannot afford one is a priority of the Diocese of Lansing. These endowed funds will be used to provide need-based financial aid to students attending Catholic schools from grades K-12. This endowment will augment the funds from the current school assessment and provide substantially more resources to assist families who desire the blessing of a Catholic education. Funds will be provided on a need basis and will be capped at \$1,000 per child until the growth of the endowment allows for the cap to be raised.

Religious Education and Parent Formation: \$2.7 Million

Most children are formed in the foundation of their faith in the family and at the parish level. These funds will be endowed and used to provide every parish in the diocese with more resources to provide religious education through online programs such as "Formed"*. In addition, these funds will also allow parishes to provide the parents with a parallel online program that will allow them to be engaged more fully in the religious formation of their children and inspire their deeper commitment to live their own faith within their families and parish community. The Evangelization Endowment below will complement this effort by providing parish leaders with training to engage and actively involve parents in the religious education of their children and the life of their parish.

Evangelizing and Living Our Faith: \$13.5 Million (Matthew 28:19)

Evangelization is considered the Church's essential mission. We must find creative new approaches to present the timeless truths of our faith and inspire people to live in and for Jesus Christ as a part of a vibrant faith community. The Holy Father has also called us to provide support for those who live on the margins of our world. Living the Gospel message to care for those in need is an important evangelization effort that must be continued. These funds will be provided in addition to existing support from the DSA.

Catholic Charities: \$10 Million

Total support for Catholic Charities will be broken down in the following manner:

Catholic Charities Endowment: \$6.5 Million

The annual distribution from this endowment fund would be used to support ongoing and new direct service programs at the five (5) Catholic Charities agencies. Each agency would receive funding every year but the total amount provided to each agency would be determined based on proposals submitted to the Board of Directors of the Catholic Foundation of the Diocese of Lansing and would be awarded based on funding need and service priority.

Catholic Charities Capital Needs: \$3.5 Million

There are five Catholic Charities agencies in the Diocese of Lansing that serve the 10 counties of the diocese. Each of the five Catholic Charity agencies and two important parish-based social ministry programs with broad outreach will benefit from capital support to improve their facilities so they can continue providing their vital services. These funds will be distributed as follows:

New Evangelization Initiatives: \$3 Million

Supporting Evangelization at the parish level, especially in the areas of leadership, youth and young adult ministry, and Hispanic ministry are essential to the future of the Church. These funds will support these ministries in the following ways:

- Parish Leadership Training to increase the effectiveness of paid parish staff.
- Subsidies for Lay and Deacon Training, especially Spanish language training
- Increased Tuition subsidies for training for youth, young adult and Hispanic leaders
- Evangelization Grants to assist parishes in implementing cutting edge programs to bring people to Christ
- Technology grants to allow parishes and the diocese to spread the Gospel through use of various media
- Stipends for four Evangelization Coordinators from parishes who will serve as regional resource and support agents for ongoing evangelization efforts

Distance Learning and Ministry Training Centers: \$500,000

Taking advantage of the latest communications technology, *Witness to Hope* will fund the creation of Distance Learning and Ministry Training Centers throughout the diocese, bringing broad access to excellent programming for evangelization programs, leadership training and formation, and the support of other ministry activities for parishioners, staff, and volunteers at parishes and schools throughout the diocese.

Caring For Our Priests: \$7.5 Million (II Timothy 4:7)

Priest Pension Fund: \$4.5 Million

After a life of service to the Church, it is right to honor the sacrifice of our priests and show our appreciation for their service by helping them retire and live their entire lives with dignity and required healthcare. As our priests are now living longer, these funds will bring the funding to an appropriate level for the present and future number of elderly priests in the Diocese of Lansing.

Seminary Education and Formation Endowment: \$3 Million

- **St. John Vianney Endowment for Collegiate Seminarians - \$1 Million**

The income of this endowment would be used to provide financial aid for collegiate level (undergraduate) seminarians on a need basis. Need would be determined through the process currently used by the Board of Directors of the Bishop Joseph Albers Trust.

- **St. John Paul II Major Seminary Education & Formation Endowment - \$2 Million**

The income from this endowment fund would be also used for tuition, fees, and formation programs for seminarians of the Diocese of Lansing attending major seminary (pre-theology and graduate level) as assigned by the Bishop of Lansing.

Supporting Our Shared Ministry: \$6 Million (II Corinthians 9:7)

The 2017 Diocesan Service Appeal: \$5 Million

Witness to Hope will sustain the operating costs for the essential ministries and programs funded by the DSA for the fiscal year 2017-2018. There will be no direct solicitation for DSA in 2017. The DSA will resume in 2018.

Support for the Cathedral of St. Mary: \$1 Million

These funds will be used to update the heating system, install air conditioning and improve the sound system in the Cathedral.

The People of God: A Community of Gifted Believers
